No Child Left Behind—Year 2



The *No Child Left Behind Act of 2001* (NCLB) is now two years old, and schools in New Jersey are beginning to face its full impact. The purpose of this conference, designed specifically for New Jersey superintendents, is to address developments

regarding accountability, measurement and school reform.

NCLB requires educators to use student outcomes on standardized tests as indicators of how well schools are functioning. Now that school superintendents have the first year test scores, many are struggling with how to interpret and react to the results in order to properly evaluate and support their schools.

This conference will address key issues regarding school accountability. Specifically speakers will address New Jersey's accountability system and new student and school database, as well as the likelihood that these new accountability systems will improve student outcomes.

The keynote address will provide an international perspective on school reform.

Directions:

TO PRINCETON, NJ BY CAR

From the New Jersey Turnpike heading South - Take Exit 9 (New Brunswick) and follow signs for Trenton (Route 18 north, then Route 1 south). Take the first right after toll booths, up the ramp and onto to 18 north. Immediately, shift to lane second from left and, less than half a mile from entry point, exit left (over Route 1 overpass). Stay in right lane — the exit to Route 1 south is on the right just beyond the overpass. Follow signs on Route 1 to Princeton University.

From the New Jersey Turnpike heading North - Take Exit 8 (Hightstown), and follow signs to Route 133/Princeton. Take Route 133 to end and exit onto Route 571 west, following straight across Route 1 and into Princeton.

From Interstate 95 heading North from DC/Philadelphia - Exit at either Route 206 north or Route 1 north. Following Route 206 north, pass through Lawrenceville to Princeton, or, following Route 1 north, exit at Alexander Road and follow signs for Princeton.

Parking:

AT PRINCETON UNIVERSITY

Parking will be available on-campus ONLY to attendees who have pre-registered. Once your registration is received, you will receive a confirmation by return mail or email. The confirmation will include your parking pass and a map of the Princeton University campus, indicating the available lot. Shuttle service will be available from the assigned lot to Robertson Hall; times and locations will be indicated on your confirmation.

A limited number of on-street metered parking spaces are available on Prospect Avenue, which runs parallel to Robertson Hall.

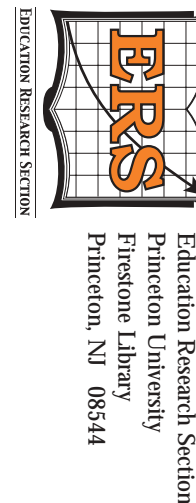
